1. Welcome and Apologies

2. Declarations of Interest. Jack asked if there any Declarations of Interest - there were none.

3. Police Report.

- **3.1** The report had been circulated and Michael asked for comments.
- **3.2** There have been reports of indiscriminate parking on East and West High Street during the month of December. A large number of vehicles have been issued with advisory notices. A further letter drop to all residents is planned in 2017 that will explain offences in relation to parking. Any vehicles that flout or ignore this advice and are clearly causing an obstruction will be issued with a fixed penalty ticket. Further patrols will continue to be carried out and any vehicles reported or seen parked illegally will be dealt with robustly.
- **3.3** The pedestrian trial coming from the church onto Mid Row has been partially successful. It may be that only one side is utilised in the end. There has been feedback from residents which has been mixed and concerns have been raised surrounding the barriers placed on the Church side of the junction and how vehicles manoeuvre. The Council are still keen to improve the set up for pedestrians at the junction but need to take in to account the difficulties some large vehicles have had when turning with barriers on both sides of the road. As a result of these difficulties the trial will be extended until the middle of March and the barriers on the Church side of the junction will be removed.
- **3.4** David reminded the meeting that the Head of Lauder Fire Station has not yet written to explain to the Council about the problems with parking up beside the Industrial Estate blocking the fire engine getting out. PC Norrie agreed that the Police could help with this. It was noted that there are usually about 20 cars parked on one side of the road making it single track.
- **3.5** It was also noted that bird flu is still a risk and that avian owners should be aware that they cannot let birds outside.

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- 4. Minute of previous meeting. This was proposed by Judi and seconded by Edward.

- 7. Reports
 - 7.1 Planning. Extension to Cottage at Whitlaw. No comment

 - 7.4 **Revitalisation**. It was noted how useful Mike O'Neill's contribution has been and Craig will liaise with him for the future. It was agreed to have a further Revitalisation meeting before the next CC meeting and a date will be arranged. The Lego Club has inherited a huge amount of stock and Jack asked for help as this has got too big for one person to handle!
- **8.** Lauder in Bloom Reception. David offered a vote of thanks to Alistair and Wendy Lyle for making the evening such a success.
- 9. Use of Police Station. This is not ready for public use yet.
