#### **ITEM 8 - REPORTS**

Lauder in Bloom (LIB) - it was agreed to wait until Ruth could attend.

Walking Festival – this is being followed up.

<u>Joint Venture with Church</u> – During 'Tour de Lauder' it will be arranged that there could be entertainment and activities for children for around 2 hours while the 'Tour' was en route. Planning: New house at St Leonards – no objection.

Re-arrangement at Coop/garage. It was agreed to draw attention to the prospect of cars parking on the road between the entrance to Brownsmuir Park and the new entrance to the pumps beyond which could be dangerous. Also there is no sign for the large car park to the rear. Anxiety was expressed about the placement of the ATM and whether this would lead to dangerous parking.

An application is in process to build a house at Lauder Barns on an old dump which is contaminated land. This is causing problems.

<u>Windfarms:</u>. A 4<sup>th</sup> proposal for turbines at Muircleugh has been received. It was agreed that this should be objected to on the same grounds as the previous – visual impact, damage to views on Lauder Common and cumulative effect.

A Public Enquiry for the Girthgate development has been confirmed. After discussion, it was agreed that the Planning Committee would contact other affected CCs with a view to putting a joint case to the Enquiry.

Common Good – this will be discussed at the next meeting.
