Security In The Rural Enviroment

Residents and farmers are reminded to check and update any security surrounding their homes and businesses following recent reports of a number of thefts across the Scottish Borders.

Shut Out Scammers Spot the Signs

This week, Police Scotland are running its <u>Shut Out Scammers campaign</u>, designed to raise awareness of offenders who cold-call people at their homes and scam them out of money. Doorstep criminals may offer to carry out work at a reduced rate, asking you to hand over cash straight away and often in advance of any repairs being carried out. There is no specific look to a bogus caller or rogue trader. Be alert and if you have any concerns at all, do not allow an individual entry to your home, or provide them with any form of payment. Do not hesitate to phone the police immediately on 101 or 999 in an emergency. "Always ask for ID and only let callers in if they have an appointment and you know that they are genuine. Divisional traffic have issued 4 fixed penalty tickets for speeding out with the boundaries of Lauder on the A68 during the month of May 2019.
