#### Indiscriminate parking

You highlighted parking as a problem locally, the following was recorded regarding parking issues during the month of November 2019.

12/11/2019 – Theft of Caravan & Vandalism – Thirlestane Castle- Enquiry Ongoing 30/11/2019 – Fraud – Thirlestane Drive- Enquiry Ongoing 03/12/2019 – Theft Housebreaking – Market Place – Enquiry Ongoing

In addition to the Theft of the Caravan at Thirlestane Castle and the Theft HB at the Post Office, there was also a sighting of white van acting suspiciously around 26/11/2019.
