1. Welcome and Apologies

2. Conflicts of Interest. None so far.

3. Police Report.

- 3.1 The police report had been circulated to LCC members and on Facebook.
- 3.2 Calum reported that in future, police reports would be centralised to save work and that his report would be part of the Tweedbank, Melrose, Earlston, Lauder and Oxton areas.
- 3.3 Liz from the floor reported that dog poo had been found in the Children's Play Park and the Wooden Play Park. Judi and Kevin agreed to chase up more stencils for the payments and to report incidents to the police if necessary.
- 4. Appointment of Vice Chairman. This will be taken off the agenda for the time being.

5. Presentation by Jim Fraser of Resilient Communities

- Jim gave a very interesting presentation on how Resilient Communities works, what a benefit it is to the local community and how each Community Council can apply. Each community council area would enlist a coordinator who will liaise with the Response Team at SBC. One of the main advantages is the free training for members.
- 5.2 It was agreed to put leaflets on Facebook and into the local shops to assess interest.

6. Adoption of Minute of previous meetings.

The November Minute was approved by Rachel and seconded by Jack and the December Minute was approved by Judi and seconded by Rachel.

7. Celebration of 75th Anniversary of VE Day. - 9.2 The sign for Brownsmuir Park has been knocked over and needs restored.
- 9.3 The Row needs resurfacing.
- 9.4 The gulley box at the bus stop opposite the chip shop is blocked as is the one in Milburn Park. The A68 end of Manse Road has a drain without a cover which is getting filled with rubbish.
