Community Policing News – Leaderdale and Melrose

We are continuing to appeal for the drivers of vehicles using the A6091 Melrose bypass when a woman was hit and seriously injured on Sunday 12th March 2023. This occurred around 9.50pm near to the Borders General Hospital, and the woman remains in a critical condition.

We are keen to speak to anyone who saw a dark-coloured SUV and a 4x4 at the time of the crash as well as the drivers of these cars as they may have vital information.

Protecting most vulnerable

In March 2023 Police in the Scottish Borders attended and were involved with around ** mental health related calls, around ** missing person enquiries and approximately ** domestic related incidents.

Leaderdale & Melrose had ** mental health related calls and ** missing person enquiries. Due to GDPR and protection of victims/subjects involved, we are unable to share any more specific information in relation to these type of call within this report.

Reducing Violence and Anti-Social Behaviour

Assaults

On 08/03/2023 report of a disturbance in hospital, Melrose. Male arrested for various offences.

On 11/03/2023 report of abuse from residents in Oxton, complainer a van driver. Further enquiries to be made with complainer.

On 16/03/2023 report of a strange male hanging around shop in Tweedbank. Male not identified. No crimes. Crime prevention advice given to staff.

On 19/03/2023 report of an altercation with a driver in The Avenue, Lauder. No trace of car in question. No corroboration.

On 21/03/2023 report of suspicious males in Mid Row, Lauder. Persons concerned traced and spoken to, appear they were looking for an Air B&B nearby. No concerns.

On 25/03/2023 report of disturbance in a property in Priorswalk, Melrose. Young female had taken tantrum. All calmed down on arrival of police.

Reducing Acquisitive Crime

Theft by Housebreaking

On 14/03/2023 report of housebreaking in Cranston Road, Lauder. Officers attended, crime report submitted.

On 22/03/2023 report of housebreaking to business premises at Tweedbank Industrial Estate, Tweedbank. Appointment made to speak with complainer.

Theft

On 02/03/2023 report of a possible fraud in Abbotsferry Road, Tweedbank. Arrangements made to see complainer on 05/03/2023 to establish if a crime has been committed.

On 13/03/2023 report of theft from a care home at Drygrange Mains, Melrose. Appointment made to speak to complainer.

On 16/03/2023 report of goods being bought with stolen cards. Credit companies then obtaining money back leaving premises at a loss. Males responsible not known. Complainer still to be seen.

Improving Road Safety

On 12/03/2023 a female was seriously injured in a road collision on Melrose Bypass, Melrose. Enquiries ongoing.

Campaigns

Keep Safe Initiative

Divisional Domestic Abuse campaign

Ongoing engagement with main local employers to share campaign messages, information in relation to local support services and charities and prevention messages targeting perpetrators directly.
